### What else do you pray about?

It is seemly that the servant should, after each prayer, supplicate God to bestow mercy and forgiveness upon his parents. -The Báb

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In the highest prayer, men pray only for the love of God. -`Abdu'l-Bahá

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Strive thou, then, to praise and glorify God... -'Abdu'l-Bahá

It behoveth the servant to pray to and seek assistance from God, and to supplicate and implore His aid. -ʿAbduʾl-Bahá

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...we must not be rigid about praying: there is not a set of rules governing it; the main thing is we must start out with the right concept of God, the Manifestation, the Master, the Guardian -we can turn, in thought, to any one of them when we pray. For instance you can ask Bahá'u'lláh for something, or, 'thinking of Him. ask God for it. The same is true of the Master or the Guardian. You can turn in thought to either of them and then ask their intercession, or pray direct to God. As long as you don't confuse their stations, and make them all equal, it does not matter much how you orient your thoughts. -Written on behalf of Shoghi Effendi

While praying it would be better to turn one's thoughts to the Manifestation as He continues, in the other world, to be our means of contact with the Almighty. We can, however, pray directly to God Himself. -Written on behalf of Shoghi Effendi

You have asked whether our prayers go beyond Bahá'u'lláh: it all depends whether we pray to Him directly or through Him to God. We may do both, and also can pray directly to God, but our prayers would certainly be more effective and illuminating if they are addressed to Him through His Manifestation, Bahá'u'lláh. Under no circumstances, however, can we, while repeating the prayers, insert the name Bahá'u'lláh where the word "God" is used. This would be tantamount to a blasphemy. -Written on behalf of Shoghi Effendi

As regards your question: Bahá'u'lláh is, of course, not God and not the Creator; but through Him we can know God, and because of this position of Divine Intermediary, in a sense, He is all (or the other Prophets) we can ever know of that Infinite Essence which is God. Therefore, we address ourselves in prayer and thought to Him, or through Him to that Infinite Essence behind and beyond Him. -Written on behalf of Shoghi Effendi 9
