Hohou te rongo - a process to re-establish peace for people who have been at war - both parties who are affected participate, and have their mana restored. Traditionally, marriages took place, and gifts exchanged.

Rongo - the god of peace.

Mana - spiritual life-force energy; healing power that permeates the universe.

He Whakaputanga (1835) - the Declaration of Independence.

- Instigated by Māori - eventually signed by 52 rangatira/chiefs
- A Declaration of Independence flag created
- Recognised by King William 4th
- Before Te Tiriti o Waitangi/ The Treaty of Waitangi - 1840

‘Te ahu ko iwi’ - the tradition of burying people in shallow graves that were dug up a year or so later. The bones were cleaned and painted, and put into caves.

Papatūānuku - Earth Mother

Hinu - blubber of the whale

Atua Maori - the Maori gods

Rangimārie - quiet/ peaceful

Te hainatanga o te Tiriti o Waitangi - the signing of The Treaty of Waitangi

‘**Wai 262 Claim**’ - a significant claim made to the Waitangi Tribunal.

Kuia - respected female elder

Kaumatua - respected male elder

Rongoā - traditional healing method with plants;herbal remedies

Wahi tapu - sacred place in a spiritual, religious, ritual or mythological sense

Haka pōwhiri - haka that is part of a formal welcome

Manaakitanga - welcome

Kotahitanga - peace

Hui - meetings

Tuia 250 - commemorating Capt. Cook arriving in Aotearoa

Waiata-ā-ringa - action songs
